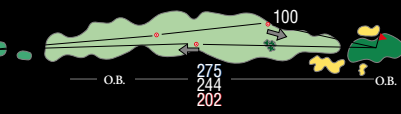


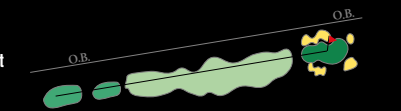
1 A good par 5 to begin your round. Long hitters can reach in two by going over, or right of, the large trees in the fairway. Others can lay up left and be left with a short approach to this green that slopes away from you. All the way down the hole, right is death.



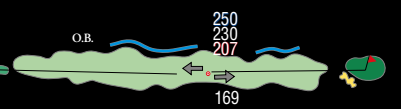
2 Our toughest test...The water is definitely in play off the tee. Your drive must be long and true in order to leave less than a long iron for your approach. If you miss short, the right side generally will give the best angle for your pitch.



3 A deceiving par 3. The short iron in your hands must be true...misses anywhere but short often lead to bogies and worse.



4 Another challenging par 4. The wide fairway encourages the strong tee shot required to set up the mid iron uphill approach. The green slopes toward you and most short shots will tend to stay there.



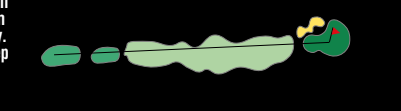
5 This reachable par 5 is protected by a number of well placed bunkers that come into play on your second shot, so load up on the drive. If you are going to run it on, there is a narrow throat fronting the green. Also, be aware that this green slopes away from you.



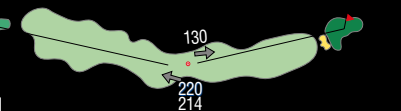
6 Accuracy will be rewarded off this tee. Drives to the right are generally preferable except when the pin is back right. This green is generally level and lower loft shots will tend to release.



7 A demanding par 3 that favours a right to left shot for those planning to run it on. All should be aware that this green slopes from right to left as well, sometimes quite subtly. Note that the bunkers front left are quite deep and sand saves difficult.



8 Our shortest par 4 will yield many birdie opportunities to the player who puts a tee shot in the fairway. Aggressive players can play a driver right to left to leave a pitch with the bunker taken out of play.



9 A strong finish to the front. Drives should be right of the tall trees in the fairway. Well hit drives will hit the slight down slope and be directed to the left side of the fairway giving the best angle of approach. Those running it on should aim left of the bunker front.
